A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRIEND, SALINE COUNTY, NEBRASKA, DECLARING THE NEED FOR A STOP SIGN DIRECTING SOUTHBOUND TRAFFIC ON CHESTNUT STREET, PAST THE INTERESECTION OF "A" STREET, IN THE INTEREST OF PUBLIC SAFETY, UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE RAILROAD CROSSING DIRECTLY SOUTH OF "A" STREET AT CHESTNUT STREET IS OFFICIALLY AND PERMANENTLY CLOSED BY THE BURLINGTON NORTHERN RAILROAD COMPANY AND THE CITY OF FRIEND.

THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FROM AND AFTERS ITS PASSAGE AND PUBLICATION OF NOTICE IN THE FRIEND SENTINEL OCCURS.

THIS RESOLUTION IS AN AMENDMENT TO THE EXISTING CITY TRAFFIC CONTROL RESOLUTION.


Resolution offered by Councilman Gill, seconded by Councilman Ross, and upon roll call vote, all members voting aye, the same was passed on December 1, 1992.

NOTICE

The Mayor and City Council, at the regular December 1, 1992 meeting, passed an amendment to the existing traffic control resolution which requires Southbound traffic on Chestnut Street, at the intersection of Chestnut and "A" Street to stop and directs the employees of the City of Friend, Street Department to install said stop sign in the interest of public safety of the driving public until such time as the railroad crossing south of "A" Street on Chestnut Street is officially closed by the Burlington Northern Railroad and the City of Friend.
